OBJECTIVES

- Inform attendees of natural history of displaced intra articular calcaneal fractures in this patient population.
- Inform attendees of evidence-based medicine surrounding calcaneal fracture treatment.
- Inform attendees of which calcaneal fracture should have surgery and which should be treated non operatively.
- Inform attendees of which pilon fractures are best treated early and which are best treated with late operative reduction.
- Inform attendees of what evidence-based medicine there is in the literature for treating pilon fractures.
- Inform attendees of long term outcome of pilon fractures with best options for optimum outcomes for patients.
- Inform attendees of which forefoot fractures require surgery and which can be treated non operatively.
- Inform attendees of why they should pre-operative plan.
- Inform attendees that surgery is a team event and that pre-operative planning makes them as surgeons and the Head of the Operative Team necessary for a safe surgical result.
- Learn to recognize the difference between acute and chronic slips.
- Inform attendees of the natural history of severe slipped capital femoral epiphysis and problems commonly encountered in the older adolescent patient.
- Inform attendees of different surgical treatment options for high grade slips.
- Inform attendees of current concepts in upper and lower extremity treatment.
- Inform attendees of topics of pediatric orthopedics.
- Discuss the national, regional, and local challenges of orthopaedic community.
- The purpose of all presentations is to increase our knowledge base and improve our techniques in critical areas of surgery and the practice of orthopaedics.
